ENJOY A SPECIAL RECIPE FROM OUR KITCHEN TO YOURS: SIMPLY SENSATIONAL TRUFFLES

Ingredients:

1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese, softened

3 cups powdered sugar

3 packages (4 oz. each) Baker's semi-sweet chocolate, broken into pieces, melted

1-1/2 tsp. vanilla

Suggested coatings: ground walnuts, unsweetened cocoa powder, powdered sugar, flake coconut.

Directions:

Beat cream cheese in large bowl with mixer on medium speed until smooth, gradually add sugar, mix until well blended. Add melted chocolate and vanilla, mix well. Refrigerate 1 hour or until chilled. Shape into 1-inch balls. Roll in walnuts, cocoa, powdered sugar or coconut. Store in refrigerator. **Yield:** Approximately 6 dozen candies.
